

TRAP RANGE RULES

1. No one will be allowed to use the trap machines until they have been checked out by the trap range officer. Those qualified will be given the combination to the lock.
2. Only approved personnel are permitted to repair or make adjustments to the traps. Report all breakdowns or other malfunctions to the trap range officer or a club officer.
3. Only club birds will be used on the large automatic trap. Birds are located in the trap-houses.
4. No pick-up birds will be used on either trap.
5. A fee will be charged for each twenty-five (25) clay targets thrown from the trap. The current fee will be posted on the trap wall and will be regulated according to market conditions. The money is to be deposited in the locked container inside the trap-houses. Targets are available to members are for use on club premises only. If there are no birds available, contact the trap range officer.
6. The above fee system and use of club birds will provide for full use of the trap range. Five people may use the large automatic trap machine at one time. Hence, you need not worry about whose birds are on the carrier. You pay only for those you shoot (or miss as the case may be). No need to stand around and wait for openings on the trap line.
7. Shooters all stand on the 16yd. line for 16yd. events. In handicap events, there shall exist a yardage difference of not more than three yards, preferably two, between the nearest and farthest shooter for safety reasons.
8. All shotguns must be unloaded with actions open while changing stations.
9. After shooting please "safety release" traps, turn traps off (Unplug Large Trap), replace cords inside trap-houses, lock trap-houses and clean up area before leaving. The large and small trap machines may be used at the same time if conditions of safe use are possible. Priority is given to the use of the large trap machine in event of conflict. However, on this point, members should use their good judgment on what to do in the event a problem exists.
10. The Canterbury Voice Call System shall only be deployed by authorized personnel.
11. Regularly scheduled organized club events shall have priority of the trap range use.
12. Trap shooters and non-trap (combat, plinkers, etc.) shooters will exercise courtesy and share the trap range on a 15-minute relay basis.
13. Eye and ear protection is required at all times on the range when shooting is being conducted. This includes shooters and spectators.
14. No person, member or non-member, shall fire a full automatic firearm, or 50-caliber BMG cartridge, without majority approval of the Executive Board. All firearms must be legally owned.
15. The maximum shooting distance for the plinking range shall be 25 yards.
16. No alcohol allowed on the trap range or the trap range parking lot.
